Curriculum Intent: History is the study of people over time. St Monica's pupils will **develop their historical knowledge and understanding** of significant individual stories, ideas and events that have shaped our world. They will **connect their knowledge and understanding to other subjects and current events** in order to understand the relevance of past events in shaping the world they live in and promote social justice, tolerance and respect.. As pupils develop their disciplinary knowledge they will **reflect on how the past has been remembered** by engaging with diverse opinions and consequences of events and decisions made in the past. Pupils will be **challenged** to question misconceptions of the past, their views on the world based on their knowledge and understanding of past events and reach informed conclusions on big questions.
